<b>dare</b>	to give	<i>da' / dai</i>	<i>date</i>	<i>dia</i>
<b>fare</b>	to do	<i>fa' / fai</i>	<i>fate</i>	<i>faccia</i>
<b>stare</b>	to stay	<i>sta' / stai</i>	<i>state</i>	<i>stia</i>
<b>andare</b>	to go	<i>va' / vai</i>	<i>andate</i>	<i>vada</i>
<b>dire</b>	to tell/say	<i>di'</i>	<i>dite</i>	<i>dica</i>
<b>venire</b>	to come	<i>vieni</i>	<i>venite</i>	<i>venga</i>
<b>uscire</b>	to leave	<i>esci</i>	<i>uscite</i>	<i>esca</i>
<b>salire</b>	to go up	<i>sali</i>	<i>salite</i>	<i>salga</i>
