How to tell time



What case to use when giving the time using hours and minutes in Russian?

Use the chart below to help you decide which case and number to use for the words час (chas, "hour") and минута (miNOOta, "minute") when giving the time in Russian using this format:

12:51 двенадцать часов, пятьдесят одна минута

dviNAtsat chiSOF, pidiSYAT adNA miNOOta

lit: twelve hours, fifty-one minutes

→ The numbers will always be nominative,

but don't forget to use masculine numbers before час and feminine before минута!

Key:

Blue:Use genitive plural
часов (chiSOF)Red:Use genitive singular
часа (chiSA)Orange:
часа (chiSA)Use nominative singular
час (chas, "hour")минут (miNOOT)минуты (miNOOty)минута (miNOOta, "minute")
